

The Issue

Identifying problems that impact physicians and patients

Physician Shortages

- A shortage of 85,000 physicians in 2020
- Shortages impact rural communities more dramatically

Opioid Crisis

- 40% of all U.S. opioid overdose deaths involve a prescription opioid
- Opioid deaths now higher than motor vehicle accidents

Crushing Student Debt

- Potential impact on primary care
- Impact on economy





Introducing Legislation

The Substance Use Disorder Workforce Loan Repayment Act of 2018

Creates a loan repayment program for individuals who serve in a substance use disorder treatment job in a mental health professional shortage area, or an area of the country where the drug overdose death rate is higher than the national average.



Advocacy Timeline – SUDs Act

October 2017 AOA collaborates with osteopathic profession to draft SUDs Act

Feb., 2018 SUDs Act introduced in the House of Representatives

March, 2018 SUDs Act introduced in the Senate

June, 2018 <u>Action Alert</u> sent to osteopathic advocates to encourage lawmakers to cosponsor SUDs Act

June, 2018 House moves to vote on SUDs Act, <u>Action Alert</u> sent to advocates to encourage House to vote yes August, 2018 Bill moves to Senate, <u>Action Alert</u> sent to advocates to request the Senate keep the SUDs Act alive

Sept., 2018 Senate passes watered down version, <u>Action Alert</u> sent to keep House version

Sept., 2018 AOA leads coalition letter to Congress featuring over 40 state and national health organization to advocate for inclusion of AOA endorsed SUDs Act

Sept., 2018 Congress keeps AOA endorsed version of SUDs Act after committee conference

October 2018 Signed by President and is now law

The AOA Public Policy team and osteopathic advocates conducted more than 225 meetings with Members of Congress and their staff on the SUDs Act






Legislation moves slowly and advocacy takes time

Very few bills become law


Breakdown of bills and resolutions by status, 108th – 115th Congress

As an osteopathic physician, I would like to thank the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) for its efforts to reduce administrative regulatory burdens for physicians by proposing to simplify documentation requirements for office and other outpatient Evaluation and Management (E/M) visits for new patients (CPT codes 99202–99205) and established patients (99212–99215).

However, I am concerned that collapsing payment rates for eight E/M visits down to two rates will not achieve its goal of reducing regulatory burden. I also disagree with the proposal to implement a multiple procedure payment reduction policy that would cut procedures by 50 percent when billed with an E/M visit appended with Modifier 25. Both of these proposals run counter to the Patients Over Paperwork Initiative, which aims to streamline regulations and reduce unnecessary burden. If CMS' top priority is to put patients first, these policies, if finalized, may have unintended consequences that threaten Medicare beneficiaries ability to access care. Frail and elderly beneficiaries with complex medical conditions stand to suffer the most, as they may have to seek



As an osteopathic physician, my team relies on me to make difficult healthcare decisions on a daily basis. Patient safety is my utmost priority, and that is being jeopardized by New Jersey House Bill 1. This legislation expands the scope of practice of Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (APRNs) by eliminating the requirement that they practice in collaboration with a physician. As written, the bill allows APRNs to replace physicians as the primary care providers under state insurance plans. This would drastically change primary care in New Jersey as patients could be seen by nurses, instead of osteopathic





On Monday, the Department of Banking and Insurance released a DRAFT Bulletin concerning implementation of the OON law which is effective on August 30, 2018.
