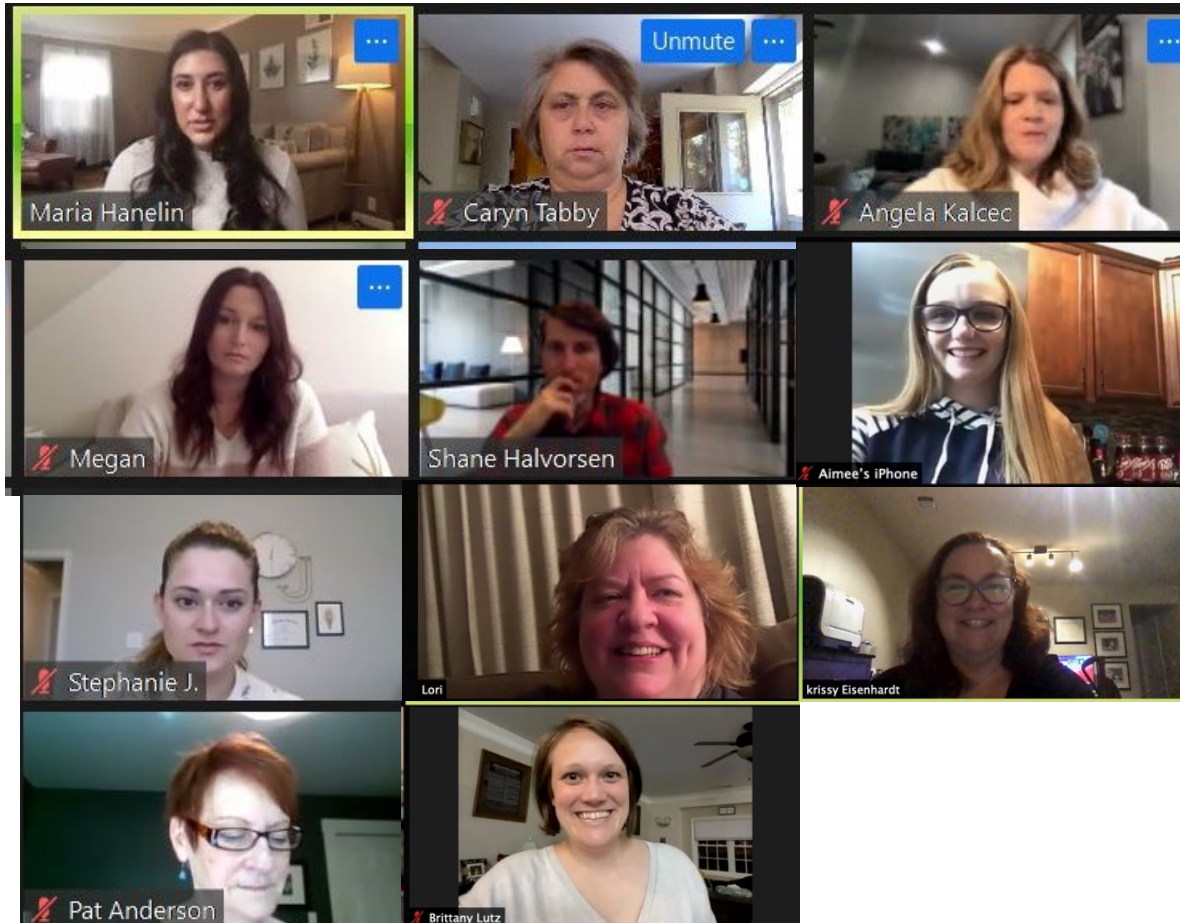

Mission Statement



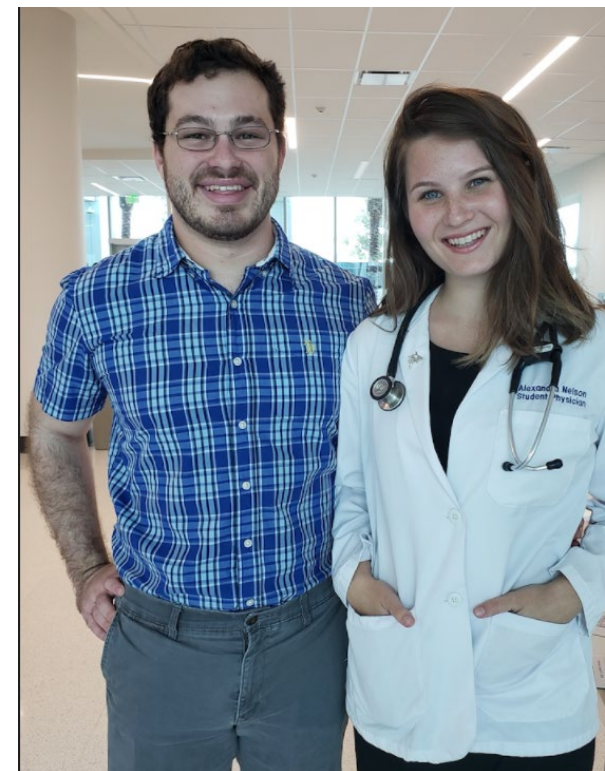

Seven Decades of Leadership

- **1949** Incorporated in Illinois as “The Osteopathic Foundation”, a nonprofit organization with the main purpose of financing and managing student loans.
- **1960** Name changed to “National Osteopathic Foundation” solidifying scope. Focus shifts from loans to scholarships.
- **1999** Foundation celebrates 50 years and changes name to the “American Osteopathic Foundation”.
- **2000** Minority Scholarship Fund awards first scholarship.
- **2002-2007** Three recognition awards programs launched – Educator of the Year, Lifetime Achievement Award, and Physician of the Year.
- **2019** First million-dollar outright gift received.
- **2019** All outstanding student loans forgiven.
- **2020** LGBTQ+ Equity and Inclusion Fund established to improve health literacy and address a wide scope of healthcare needs of the LGBTQ+ community.

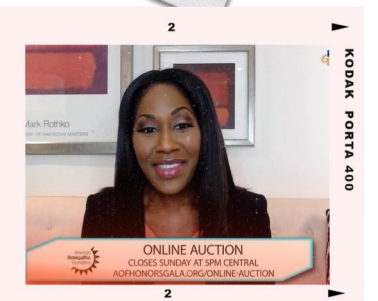

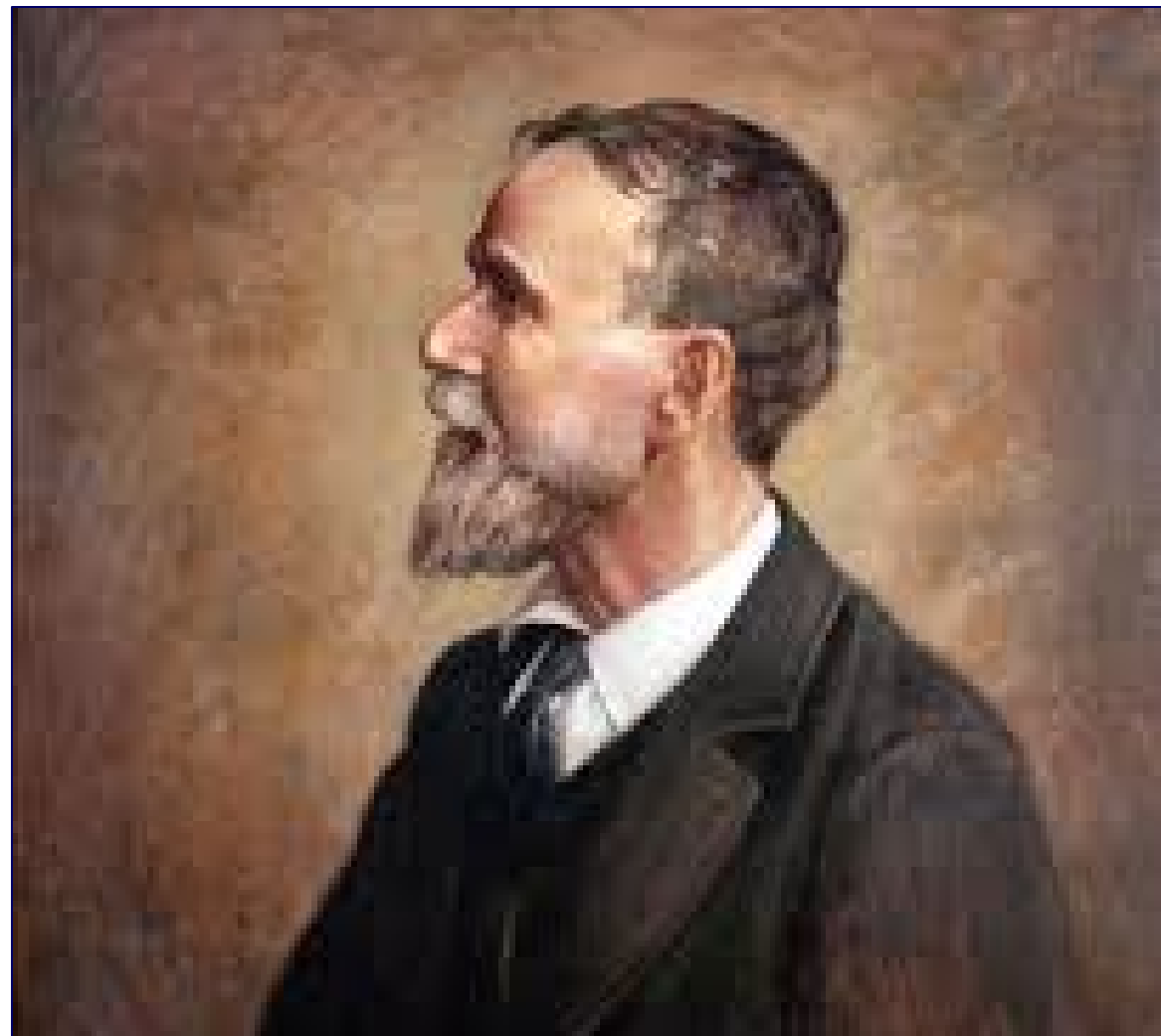

Vision: To ensure that every person worldwide has access to high-quality osteopathic healthcare.

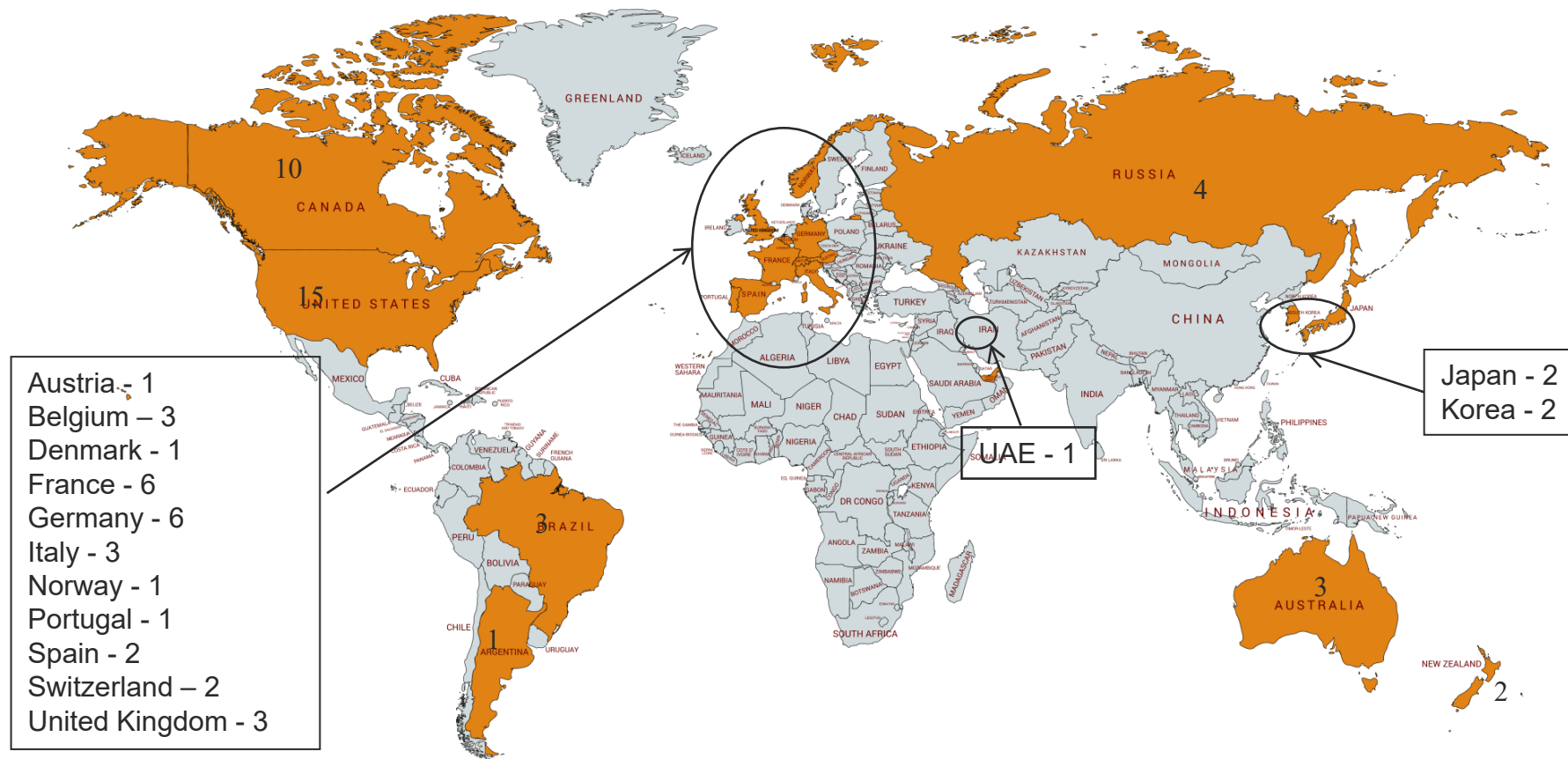

- Report submitted at 2020 BOS Annual Meeting.

Jurisdiction Committee

- Three jurisdiction petitions considered.
 - AOBS: Critical Care Neurosurgery
 - AOBS: Pediatric Neurosurgery
 - AOBPM: Wound Medicine and Surgery
- Recommendations report to be submitted at 2021 BOS Midyear Meeting (*April*).
